Thrive/ P.S.H.E

In PSHE we learn about being safe. We learn how to make informed choices and how to assess risk in a range of situations. As we grow older, we have increased independence and we learn that with independence comes responsibility. We learn that rules are there to keep us safe, how to be safe online, how to stay emotionally and physically safe in situations and also when we need to ask for help.

In our THRIVE learning, we accept ways we are different to others, identify positive things about ourselves, hear positive things about ourselves and encourage children to try new things and plan a journey.

British Values

In this term, we look at the law. We explore how the law is the same for every individual, we learn that the law is there to keep us safe and we explore why we must respect the law and what could happen if we don't. However, we also explore how the law must treat us all fairly. We relate this to our school rules. When creating our class rules and getting to know our new classmates, we focus on respect and tolerance for all. As well as this, we look at what democracy is and have the chance to vote for school councillors. This also we also relate this to individua liberty and freedom of speech.

Key Texts / Literacy

Our literacy lessons are based around the book 'The Boy Who Biked The World' by Allister Humphreys. We base our active reading and a number of book talk lessons around this exciting adventure book. For writing we are focusing on fiction by exploring the Bike Boy story and we are also going to debate if we should feed animals at national parks linking into our topic of in Derbyshire.

Art / Music / DT

This term in Art we are exploring storytelling through drawing where we explore line, shape and colour to develop evocative and characterful imagery.

In DT we are using our electrical knowledge to create torches. For Music we will be exploring the genre of Rock 'n' Roll.

Maths

We begin the term by learning the place value of numbers, count in 10s, 100s and 1000s, making estimations, ordering and rounding numbers. We then move on to addition and subtraction up to 4-digit numbers.

Safeguarding

We learn and reinforce the rules in school and how to stay safe in school when in class, forest schools, what to do during a fire drill and who we can ask for help. We learn how to stay safe online, how to stay safe in the water, how to stay safe when travelling on a train and how to stay safe around fireworks as bonfire night is approaching. We also take the first of our basic first aid lessons.

Year 4—Autumn Term 1

Derbyshire

P.E.

In P.E this term we will be looking at self defence and also playing tag rugby.

Humanities

In this term, we explore tourism, especially in Derbyshire and discuss why people would visit. We look at popular areas of Derbyshire, exploring the city, towns and villages on a map and consider their features and why they might appeal to tourists and visitors. We also look at transport and how transport has evolved over time and consider the human and environmental impact of transport and tourism.

Audience / Community

In our topic lessons we are going to raise awareness in the community by creating posters about the human and environmental impact that transport has in the local area and Derbyshire through car travel and potential impacts and how we can have a greater positive impact on the community and our envrionment.

Key SkillsWe focus on a range of different key skills this term that fall under our 'Education' and 'Life Skills' areas and will be needed for a successful year 4. These include focusing on basic numeracy and literacy skills such as capital letters and full stops, handwriting, the 200 high frequency words and place value. We also recap how to be hygienic, using a knife and fork, showing independence and asking questions about things we are unsure of.

ECO

As part of our tourism topic, we look at different modes of transport that are available in our local area and consider how and why these have changed over the years. We also consider how to make more responsible transport choices such as walking to school

Computing

We research different transport links and plan a journey from Ilkeston to somewhere else within Derbyshire. We use the computer to research, copy, paste, use a search engine, print and present into a PowerPoint presentation.

Science

In science, we are exploring sound and how it travels. We learn that light travels faster than sound and explore why we can hear a train before we see it. We explore which materials do or don't let sound travel through them and also consider pitch, volume and the dangers of sound.
